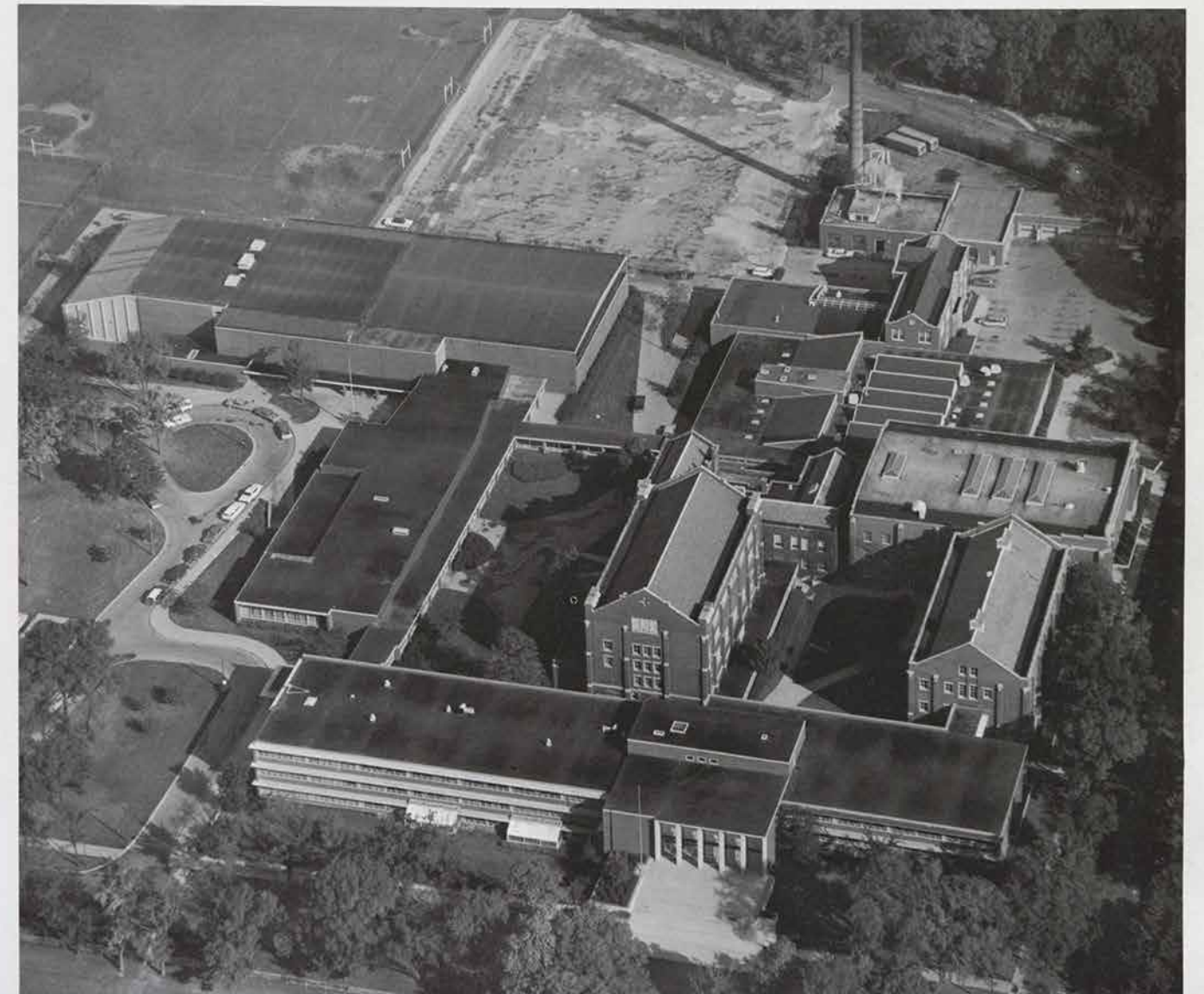

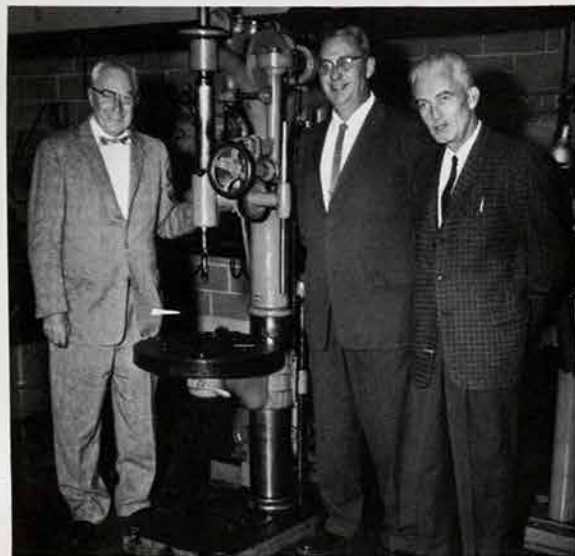

The math department is no longer sure whether $2+2=4$. With the "new mathematics" program, teachers are de-emphasizing computation and stressing an understanding of theory. During the past few years, the science department has also revamped its program, using experimental courses, such as CBA and Chem Study, as well as the more traditional approaches. The students in the experimental groups perform experiments and draw their own conclusions, rather than finding the expected results in the textbook first. An industrial arts student, working with fine equipment, applies to practical ends the theories of math and science.

Each afternoon, the east courtyard and a room on the second floor are transformed into a nursery school. Home economics students aid teachers in guiding and teaching the youngsters.

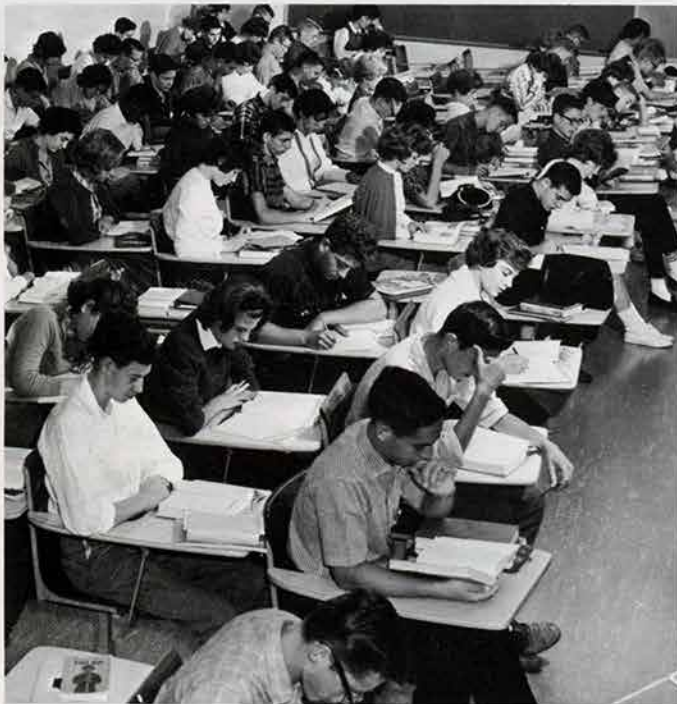


An English teacher expounded for forty minutes on a point. In a few sentences, a work centuries old came alive and inspired another generation. This lecture was one of many diverse talks presented by the five teachers participating in the E-9-10 program.



HPS is one of the first high schools in the nation to offer an Afro-Asian history and economics course. In addition to this new seminar class, the history curriculum includes Modern European

History American History, Ancient and Medieval History, and a Western Hemisphere course.



Our activities in study hall were usually confined to looking at the clock, combing our hair staring at the same page of *Moby Dick*, and passing notes. Occasionally under the pressure of a coming exam, we would cram into one period the studying we should have done in six weeks.

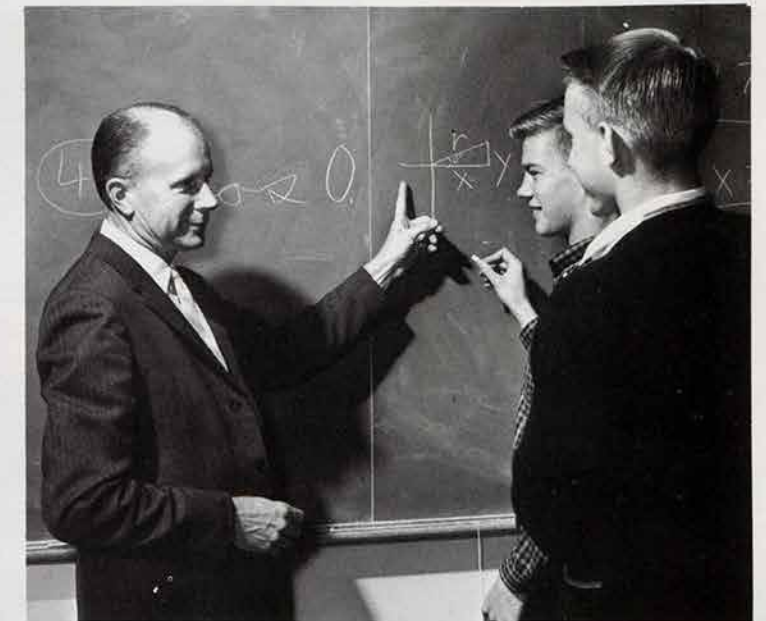


Each in a separate world of history or chemistry or language, students listen to tapes and records in the library lab room. The special equipment enables students to hear supplementary lectures or to catch up on discussions missed.



In fourth year art, students utilize the knowledge they have accumulated from previous courses. An understanding of art history and experience with crafts and the technical aspects of art aid these students in creating their final high school masterpieces.

The teacher gives the signal, and the clicking and ringing sounds fill the room. Working against the clock, the typing students do exercises to determine their speed.



Unlike instructors in many other high schools, our teachers ungrudgingly come to school early and stay late. This teacher feels that students' questions whether they be on algebra, geometry trigonometry or calculus — should always be answered.



Intently listening, these language students prepare to respond orally to the questions asked in the foreign language tapes. The control board enables the instructors to tune in the booths and note the students' progress. Now in its third year of operation, our language lab has facilities for 30 students. Each class goes to the lab one period a week to hear tapes and records in French, Spanish, or German.

Chemistry students perform experiments and interpret the results. Our chemistry program includes experimental courses based on the chemical bond and chem study approaches. HPHS offers four years of science, ranging from freshman courses to physics and advanced chemistry.



A lasting memory of high school will be of the anxious, panicky moments before our major tests, of our numbness during the exams, and of our relief when they were over. Achievements, ACT's, SAT's, ACE's, College Boards — all were part of the grueling battery of exams we faced as we prepared for college.



ORGANIZATIONS



CLUBS, CAPERS KEPT STUDENTS BUSY

We do not always study. At HPHS non-studying school activities are called "extracurricular activities" or "participation in organizations." These activities are carried on by student groups varying greatly in membership and interest.

Organizations are flexible at HPHS. If we are interested in an activity or subject not already covered, we may induce a teacher to sponsor the club, then write a constitution, and become recognized as an official organization.

The diversity of the clubs shows the diversity among HPHS's 1800 students. Interests vary from semi-academic to artistic to athletic. Archaeology Club is interested in the past; the Science

Club in the future. HGA and Varsity Club encourage athletic prowess and competition; the Cheer Squads and Pep Club arouse sideline enthusiasm for sports. Garrick Club members face an audience; the Stage Crew is reflected in the glow of the lights. Both Debate Club and Rifle Club allow students to let off hot air but in different ways.

Participation in one or several of the close to 30 organizations and activities available at HPHS is valuable. While membership in too many clubs may cancel the benefits, activities are a vital part of our whole education.

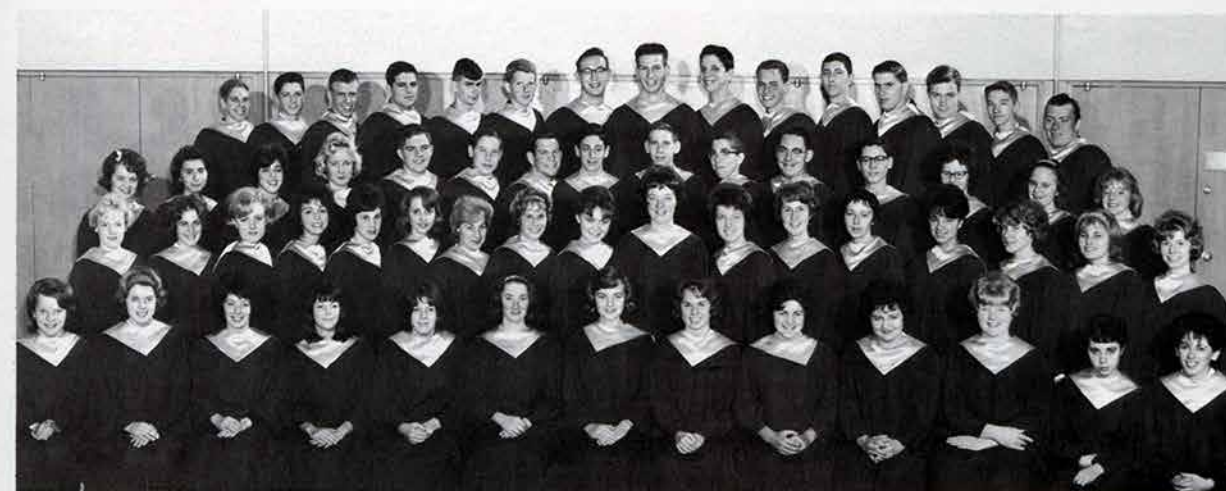

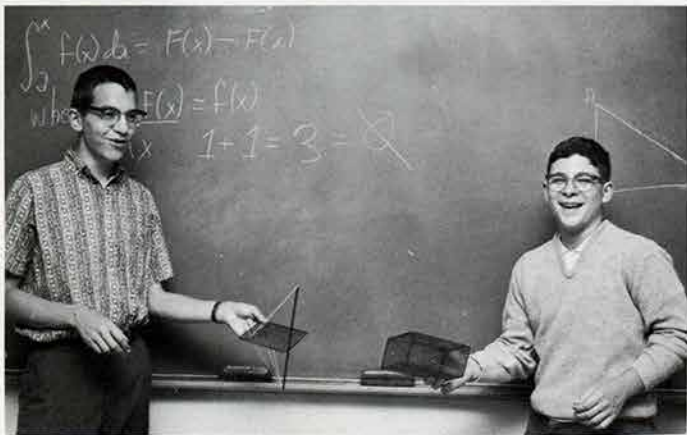

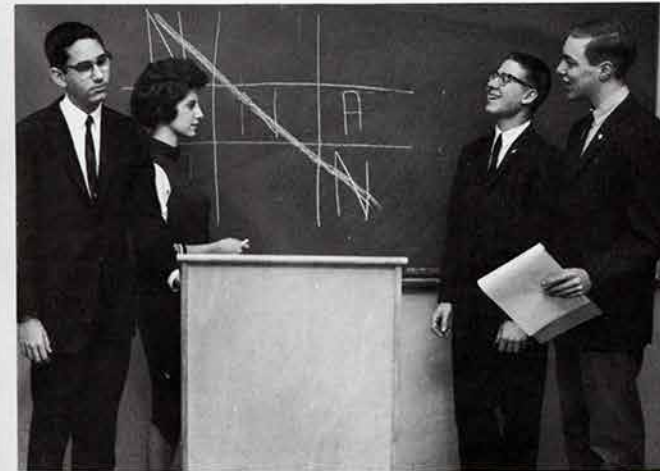

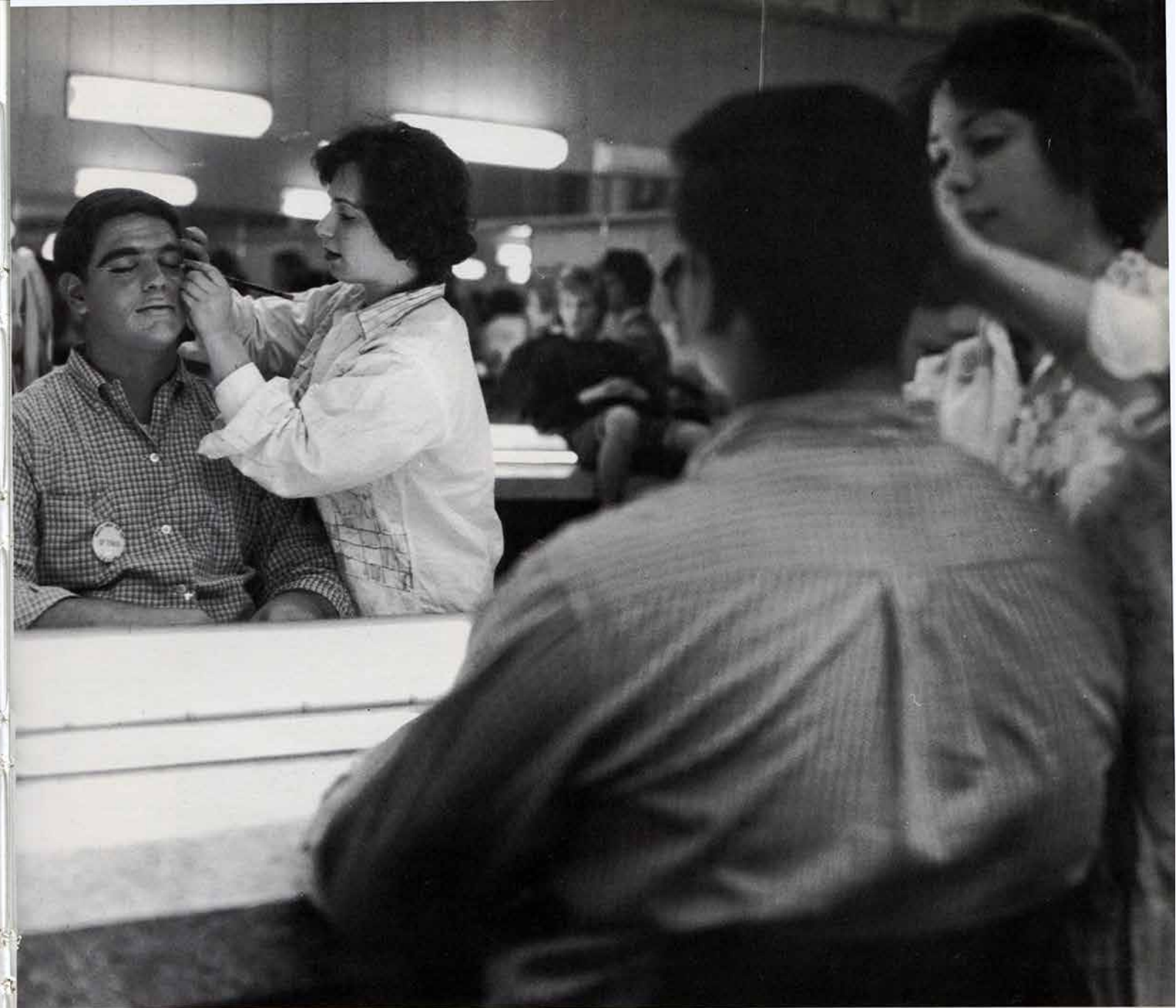
CREATIVE ARTS CLUB

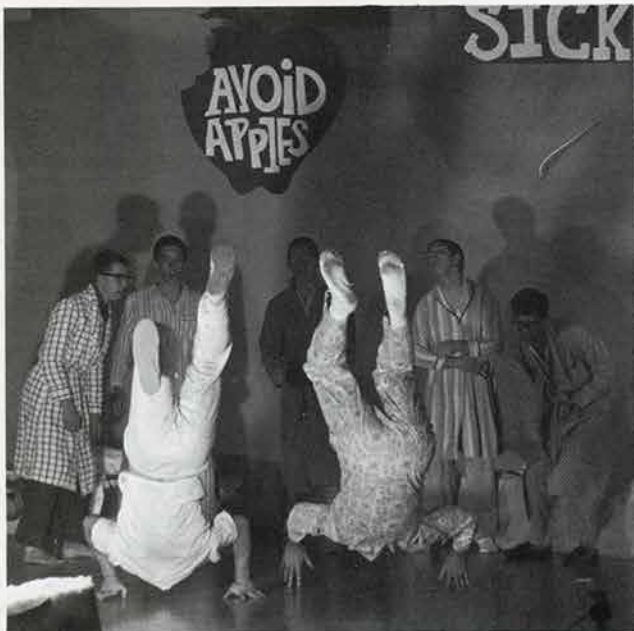

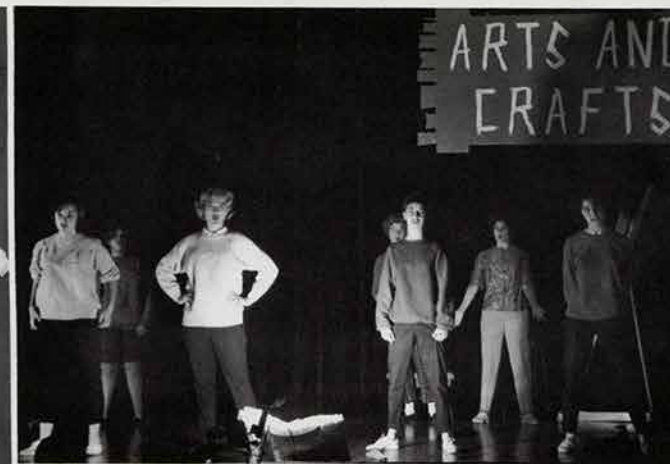

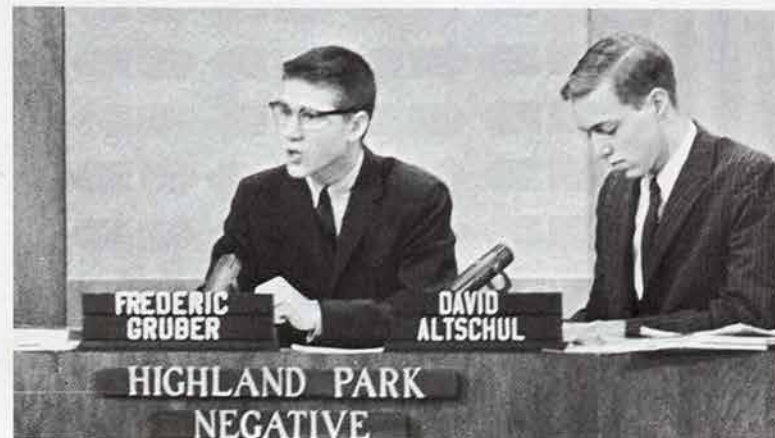
Vivien Clair

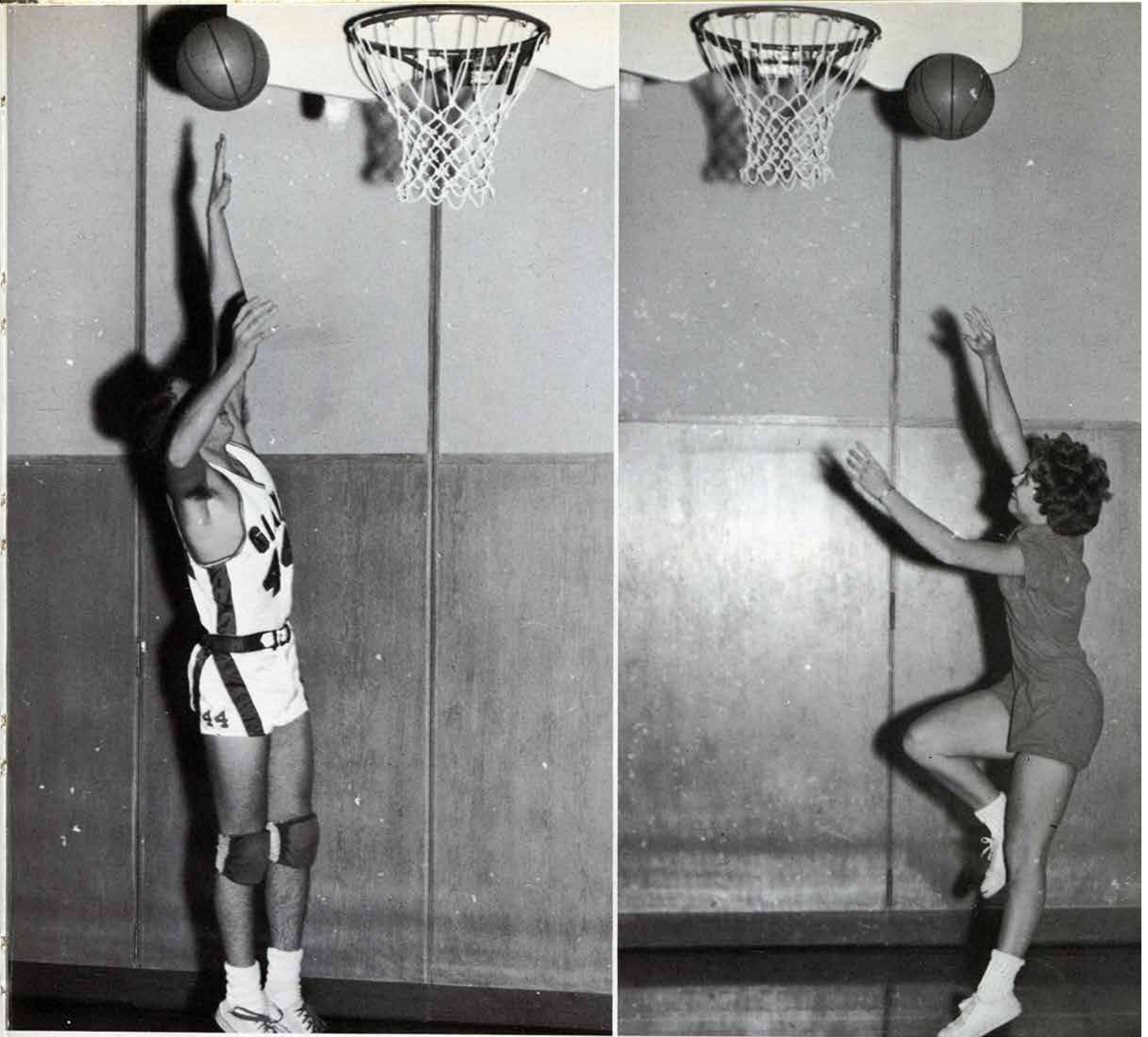

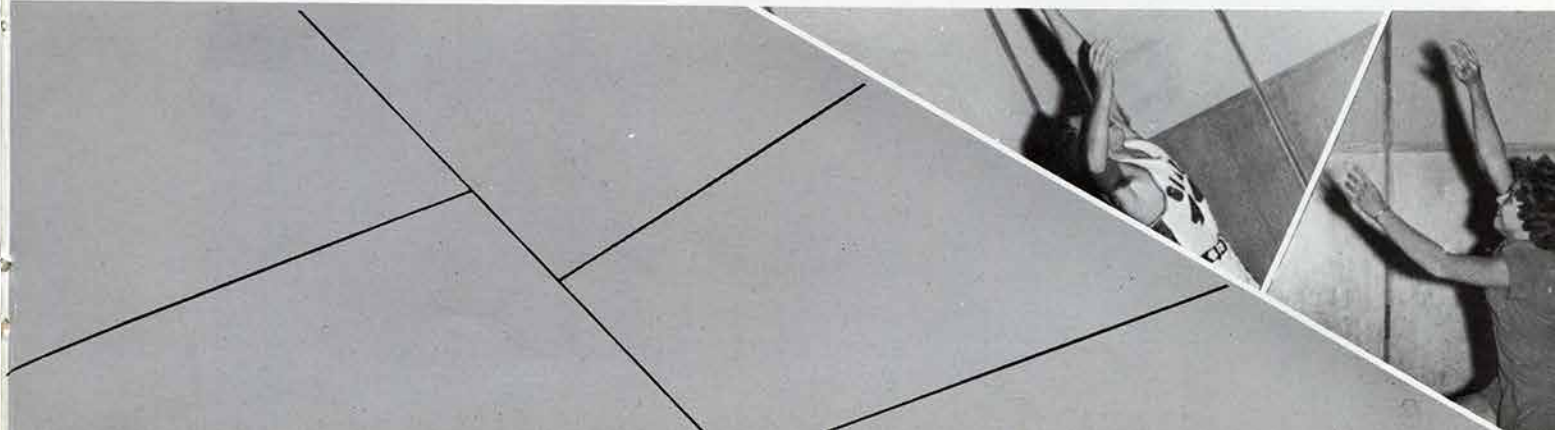
Fred Gruber and Dave Altschul defeated John Marshal Harlan High School, Chicago, on "Rebuttal" in the first round of the TV debates.

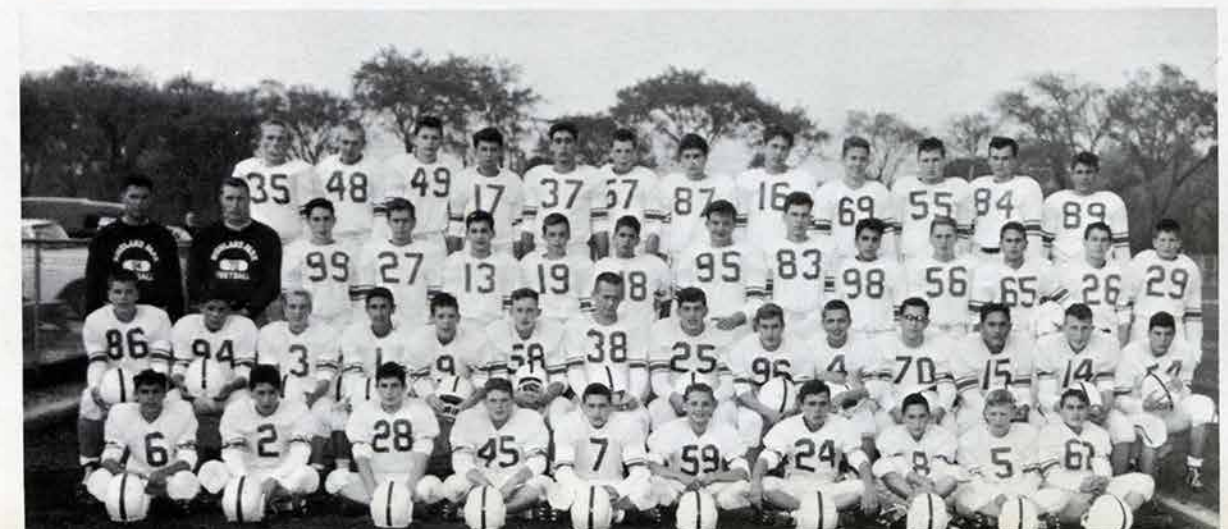

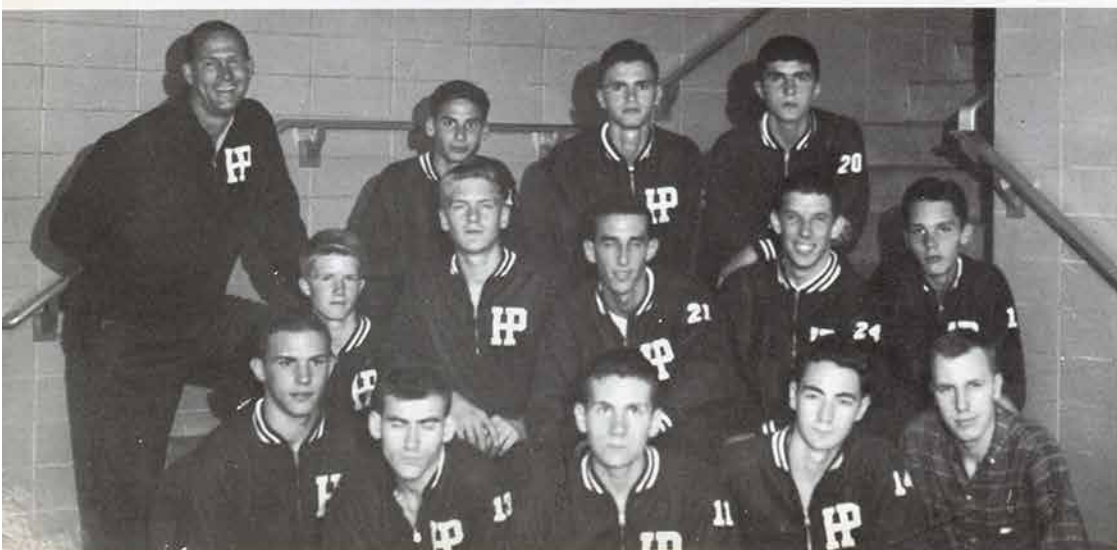

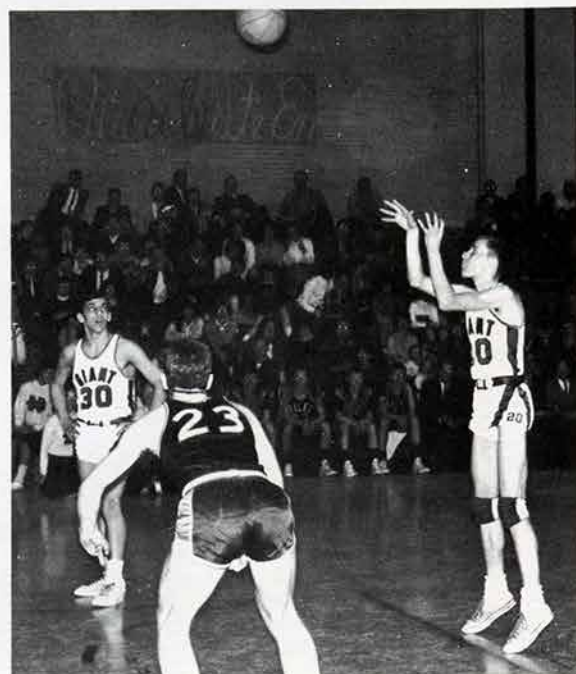

CAGERS BATTLED THROUGH DISAPPOINTING SEASON

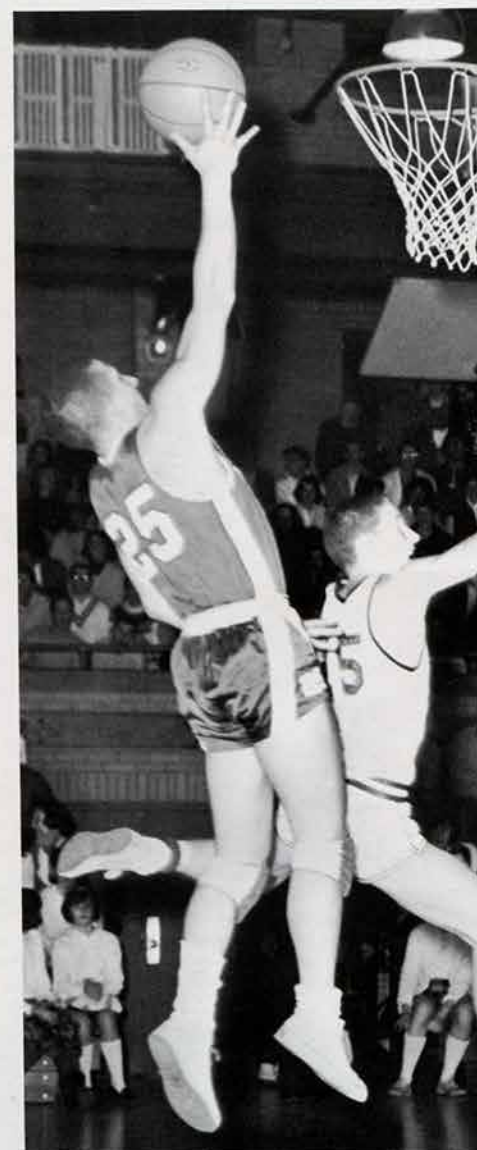
